DIRECTIONS TO THE PETER HERDIC TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM

From the North: Take U.S. Route 15 South to Williamsport's Maynard Street Exit. Turn left onto Maynard St., turn right onto West Fourth St., turn left onto Trinity Place.

From the South: Take U.S. Route 15 North to Williamsport which turns into Market Street, turn left onto West Fourth Street, go less than 1 mile and turn right onto Trinity Place.

From the East: Take Interstate 80 West to Interstate 180 to Williamsport's Maynard St. Exit, turn right onto Maynard St., turn right onto West Fourth St., turn left onto Trinity Place.

From the West: Take Interstate 80 East to Interstate 180 follow 180/U.S. 220 North to Williamsport's Maynard Street Exit. Turn left onto Maynard St., turn right onto West Fourth St., turn left onto Trinity Place.
